Nipah Virus (NiV)

Background:

- A <u>zoonotic virus</u>, meaning it can spread between animals and people.
- Natural hosts are fruit bats.

Causes:

- Contact with infected animals or their body fluids
- Contaminated food products
- Close contact with a person infected by NiV or with their body fluids





Signs & Symptoms:

- Fever
- Headache
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Difficulty breathing
- · Vomiting
- Muscle pain

- In severe cases:
- Disorientation, drowsiness & confusion
- Seizures
- Brain swelling (encephalitis)
- Death may occur

Treatment:

Supportive care

- Rest
- Hydration
- Treatment of symptoms as they

occur



Prevention:

- Wash hands regularly with soap and water.
- Avoid contact with sick animals.
- Avoid eating or drinking products that could be contaminated by bats.
- Avoid contact with the body fluids of an NiV infected person.
