## National Conference on 'Psychology – Transcending Barriers for a Better Future'

The inauguration of the 2-day National Conference on 'Psychology – Transcending Barriers for a Better Future' was held on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020 in L.F. Rasquinha Hall. Dr Anil Kakunje, Prof. and Head, Dept of Psychiatry, Yenepoya Medical College, Mangaluru was the Chief Guest. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz, SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions, presided over the programme. Rev. Dr



Praveen Martis, SJ, Principal, Dr Shalini Aiyappa, Convener of the Conference were on the dais.

Dr. Anil Kakunje in his address said, "How important it was that the theoretical knowledge of psychology be combined with the clinical training of psychiatry in order to come together and really transcend barriers. He also spoke of the importance needed to be given to the area of mental health as it is as important as physical health in one's life. He highlighted some of the stigmas related to the treatment that the field offers as most people prefer going to faith dealers in search of a cure. He also expounded on the need for women to continue breaking barriers and enter the field in more numbers. He concluded by expressing the need for psychology and psychiatry to join hands even at the college level with integrated courses that help students get the best of both worlds. This was followed by Rev. Fr. Dr. Praveen Martis SJ's speech in which Fr. congratulated the department of



psychology for conducting such a national level conference as the theme of transcending barriers caused by prejudices and stereotypical views was very befitting. The Presidential address was delivered by Fr. Dionysius Vaz SJ, Rector of St. Aloysius Institutions. He spoke about the importance of psychology in day-to-day life by asking the very searching question of "What is the ultimate purpose of our emotions?" the ultimate purpose of our emotions, he said, was survival and transcendence. He spoke about how the beauty of psychology lies in the way we see ourselves in relation to others while talking

about what could be best for the whole rather than what could be best for the individual. He concluded his presidential remarks by urging the students to "become their original selves."

The conference focused on the areas of neuropsychology, child and adolescent psychology, design thinking and sports psychology by the experts like Dr. Jamuna Rajeswaran, Professor and the Head, Clinical and Cognitive Psychology Unit, NIMHANS. Dr. Roopesh B Nagraj, Additional Professor of the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Unit, NIMHANS. The conference also included a workshop on the 'Theatre of the Oppressed' conducted by Mr. Ravi Ramaswamy, Trustee, Centre for Community Dialogue and Change, Bangalore.

## Industrial visit to Solara Active Pharma Sciences Pvt Ltd

Pharma Sciences at Baikampady Mangaluru, which was organized by the staff of B.Voc pharmaceutical chemistry under the guidance of Dr Richard Gonsalves. The journey began from St. Aloysius College at 9.30 AM by the College bus. The students were accompanied by Mr Ajith and Ms Deepthi M Lobo.

The PM sector consists of pharmaceutical packaging and pharmaceutical preparations, involving all of the operations from production through distribution channels to the consumer.


