Twelfth Graduation Ceremony

The twelfth Graduation Ceremony of St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru was held on Saturday, June 11, 2022 at 2.30 pm in Loyola Hall, St. Aloysius PU College Campus, and Mangaluru. It was a time of celebration where students were lauded for the efforts they put in to obtain their degrees. Eighty



rank holders and six special prize winners were awarded. 1032 UG, 475 PG and 1 PG Diploma holder, a total of 1594 graduates received their degree certificates. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz, SJ, President, Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society (MJES) and Provincial, Karnataka Jesuit Province declared the Twelfth Graduation Ceremony open. Rev. Fr Melwin Joseph Pinto, SJ, Rector, St Aloysius Institutions led the graduates pledge.

Professor P. Subrahmanya Yadapadithaya, Vice chancellor of Mangalore University was the chief guest for



the graduation day ceremony. Quoting Swami Vivekananda, Professor Yadapadithaya in his graduation address said "Education is the manifestation of the perfection already in a man and that unleashes potential of every person." NEP 2020 basically provides outcome

All of the students were seen dressed up in their best ethnic attire to college. Many students participated in cultural activities such as dance, singing, stand-up comedy, among others.




Ethnic diversity of the region was on display during the event.

Seminar on Mental Health Matters

The Department of Political Science and the Center for Extension Services at St. Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru organised the seminar titled, "Mental Health Matters" on June 08, 2022 (4.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m) in Sandihya, Admin Block
Dr Srinivas Bhat U, Department of Psychiatry, KS Hegde Medical Academy, Derlakatte, Mangaluru laid



down the context to the students that makes the knowledge of mental health and its enjoyment a necessity for the students and the youngsters in general. The ecosystem at present offers us with comforts and choices. There are times when learning from life becomes so less that he explained through an illustrated through a case that involved hasty decisions and high emotions. He pointed out that most persons manage with life wherein 8-10 out of 100 have difficulty managing problems. He explained the challenges and issues faced by adolescents and the youngsters above the age of 19 by simplifying the German-American developmental psychologist and psychoanalyst Erik Homburger Erikson's theory on identity. Dr. Bhat said that mental illnesses are largely to do with genes or acquired through heredity. These get triggered when such people undergo massive stress like loss of a loved one and further aggravates when substance abuse is involved.

The second major theme that Dr Bhat addressed in terms of mental health involved relationship, friendship, love, affairs and marriage by illustrating three examples for further effect. Through these interesting examples, he emphasised that a person needs to focus on being in-



dependent and in a position to perform actions with responsibility before committing to a relationship. Here he laid stress on the involvement of substance abuse and how it alters one's perception on

relationships and jobs and thus impairs one's decision-making. Hence, the need to approach counsellors who enable you to put "your inside out" with confidentiality. He assured that counsellors merely allow you to pour out in such a manner that you find your own solutions. In short, talking out helps you to think! Thoughts of depression and suicide can invade any mind, but how its addressed makes a difference. There is a need to improve one's lifestyle that relates to patterns of sleeping and eating. There is a greater need to be in harmony with one's inner self.

Many of the above points were reiterated and simplified during the Q&A session on exam pressure, breaking down exam stress to parents, stigma on medication for psychological problems, inbreeding and mental illness, questions of ego, deviant behaviour in childhood, and the role religiosity and spirituality plays in grooming values that enhance mental health and a healthy society.

Dr. Rose Veera D'Souza, HOD Dept. of Political Science and the co-convenor introduced Dr. Srinivas Bhat U and welcomed the gathering. Rev. Dr. Praveen Martis SJ., in his presidential message said that the College provided an ecosystem to seek help for one's problems at the student level and for others too. The session was co-convened by Ms Jennifer Ida Mascarenhas, the Dean of Extension Services. The webinar was attended by 120 students from various disciplinary backgrounds.

Achoor Tea Factory (Harrisons Malyalam Limited)

The students arrived at the Achoor Tea Factory located in Wayanad late in the morning. The workers demonstrated the entire process of making tea powder from raw, fresh tea leaves. They elaborated on how there are 4 types of tea production: white tea, CTC, green tea and black tea. The industry was involved in the production of CTC tea packing. Beginning with the dumping of the tea leaves into the withering trough which is shredded in the shredder, it is then passed through the CTC machine which has two wheels which work both clock wise and anti-clock wise. This was then taken through the fermentation drum which is 1100 degrees in temperature. It is then sent to the drier, trinic sorter and sent for winnowing. The final product is sent for binning, after which it is packed and dispatched for sale.



Uravu Indigenous Science & Technology Study Centre:

The students arrived at the Uravu centre at 11AM. The URAVU study centre educated them regarding the various Bamboo produced in Kerala, India and Worldwide. centre.

They were first taken to the Bamboo plantation where they were introduced to the various types of bamboo. After learning about the various types of bamboo, they visited their study centre.

The details of journey are as follows:

The group started their journey from St. Aloysius college, Mangalore towards Mysuru on 4 June 2022 at 10:00 PM.

On 5 June 2022, around 5:30 am they reached Mysuru and spent their day at Wonderla. On 6 June 2022, they visited Conpro bricks LTDs and then Kayne's technology India LTD. The company provided assistant along with the students to complete the visit in 45min each. They



also visited the aquarium later. The final year B.Com. students had a wonderful experience primarily since they were taken to the industry which helped them enhance their practical knowledge. The students benefitted in terms of several practical experiences from the

knowledge or idea of how simple things can be made in many different ways or forms as per the needs or wants of different individuals, as well as how the process of input remains same while what changes is only output in terms of size, color, quantity and quality. Over here the students have gained the knowledge regarding how each different thing can be started in the same way and how small changes in each step can lead a processing product to a different output. The students also got a wonderful example to understand the importance of the precision in terms of measurement of goods play a vital role and how each additional unmeasured items can mislead the exact quality of the final product. All this knowledge was learnt by the students in the visit at Conpro bricks ltd.

In the second industrial visit which was in Kayne's technology India ltd., there was a visit which was more informative and where the students could use their education knowledge in the work place. In this company permission to take phones inside was not given which actu-



ally helped in focusing more in what exactly is happening around. In this company the students found how the mother boards are made from big sheets of board and how they are been produced to a finally ready to use one. The students could see the workers working in huge line passing one finished part to an-other employee and so on. But, its over here itself where the group understood how employee's unity, understanding and adjustment in work area matters a lot as this each individual had to do very small things but each small work done by any individual matters a lot as a single undone work in between will make the whole process at pause. Here the group understood each small role at a workplace is as important as the big roles in the same work place. They learnt how coordination between any two employees play what big role in the huge firms. They also learnt how each employees help other employees to work by completing their work on time and passing it out for next process. They also learnt the importance of time management and meeting of deadlines is how important.

The students reported to John Distilleries at 3 PM. They had an enriching experience with the guide in the industry. As he explained the process of Distillation the students



were truly excited.

In this Industry they prepared single malt whiskey. From mashing to distilling, they deciphered the unique process of making single malt. They understood the rare art of distillation in fine copper pot stills, that were exclusively designed to ensure that the whiskeys owned tremendous and exquisite flavor allowing the immense ware houses to overwhelm them.

As barrel towered over them in the on-ground ware house the rich aroma of fine whiskey wafted in the air as they stepped down into the underground cellars.

They also had the privilege to visit Glazetek Systems an



industry which is pioneering the manufacture of Glass for the entire city of Goa.

The industry was constructed in 2014 by two Engineers Mr Vishwesh Kamath and Mr Mark Figueredo. They explained the hardships that they had to undergo to act in accordance with the Statutes of the Government. They explained the manufacturer and execution of diverse projects ranging from residential units to large commercial projects. They also explained how they managed their employees in the company and how difficult it was to come out of their comfort zone.

These two founders were working for different companies but it was only around 2010 they planned for this Unicorn.

Industrial Visit - B.Com D Batch

On June 03, 2022 the students of III B.Com D visited Wayanad - Banasura dam, Tea Plantation Ooty: Chocolate Factory, Tea Factory, Ooty Lake, Botanic Garden. The details of the visit is as follows.



Wayanad: Industrial trip planned on 3rd June and the first place of visit was to Wayanad a one-day tour. This one day trip included Banasura dam and Tea Estate. Departure of the trip was on 3 June from Talapady. After reaching Wayanad the students visited the tea estate.

Banasura Dam: The first visit of the industrial visit in Wayanad was to Banasura Dam.

The dam had made provisions for tourism such as small shops. The dam even had a solar power generation sector. The water level wasn't too high yet the view was magnificent.

Tea Estate: Tea processing is a method in which the leaf from

the tea plant *camellia sinensis* are transformed into the dried leaf for brewing tea. The innate flavour of the dry tea leaf is determined by the type of cultivar of the tea bush, the quality of the plucked tea leaf and the manner and quality of the production processing they undergo. After processing the tea may be blended with other types of tea or mixed with flavorants to alter the flavor of the final tea.

Ooty: On 4 June the students reached Ooty and went to the Chocolate factory and tea factory round 10am. After that they went to Ooty lake where they went



boating and enjoyed the scenic view. In the evening they went to the garden. The garden had an exquisite view. At night after dinner there was a campfire and a few games.

Chocolate Factory: On 5 June the students visited the chocolate factory in Ooty. The factory demonstrated how local chocolates are made in Ooty and the various different flavour that were produced there. The factory then nobly provided each one of them with a chocolate bar. It also had an in house store that allowed us to buy the best homemade chocolates. The Benchmarks first introduced homemade chocolates which included rum and raisin, fruit and nut, roasted almonds, fig and



honey, as well as milk chocolate.

Tea Factory:

The tea factory and museum took the students through the intricate process of how a tea leaf ultimately ends up as in a box as tea Powder. Processing involves different manners and degree of oxidation of the leaves, stopping the oxidation, forming the tea and drying it. A total of 53 students who were accompanied

by Mr Avinash and Mrs Carrel. They ensured the safety



of students and helped in the smooth functioning of the trip.

On May 28, 2022 the students of B.Com E Batch visited Kochi, Kerala. They were guided by Mr Akshith Kumar and Dr Caroleena. The details of the visit is given below.



Wonderla Industrial Visit:

The class reported to wonderla at 10:00 am and after enjoying the dry rides as well as the water rides and then came together for the industrial visit. They had a good experience with the guide in the industry as he explained how the water in the park was treated and cleaned.

It was the water plant that was supplying water to the water theme park, Wonderla. The waste water is reused,



especially for watering plants. The tank used in wonderla has a capacity of 3 lakh litres. For the pools and water slides they use 70% of drinking water and 30% of chlorine water. Every hour 50,000 litres of water gets disposed and added on. Water gets supplied continuously for around 8 hours. The dirt from the water gets collected in a different container and disposed later on.



Milma Dairy:

After the wonderla Industrial visit the batch visited the Milma Dairy on the next day and got to know how the milk was pasteurized and how the dairy actually works. The dairy had huge mechanism and every step of how the milk is pasteurized was explained to the students and also how curd was prepared. The curd could be preserved for about 7 days in the refrigerator. Every student was keen to know about all the process and had a great experience. Later on, the students were taken to the freezer room where they preserve curd and milk in bulk. The temperature in the freezer room was about four de-



grees Celsius. Later on, the students were allowed to try some milk products like milk peda and milkshakes.

Tata Tea estate:

The students were taken to the Tata tea estate to get a glance of how the tea plantation is done and were taken to the industry. The students were informed how tea powder was prepared. The tea leaves are plucked and are transported to the factory where the tea leaves are



spread across and dried. The bunching of wet tea leaves are avoided and then the moisture from the leaves are removed by natural process of drying them. Then the leaves are cut and goes through a process of fermentation. Later on these are heated and dried and the packaging is done.

Industrial Visit - B.Com G Batch

The students of III B.Com G Batch of St Aloysius College had Industrial Visit to Kochi from 19 to 21 June 2022.

The students have given the visit to the following places.

Tea Estate: June 19, 2022

The students were taken to the tea estate for a glance of how tea plantation is done and were taken to the industry where students were enlightened about how tea plant is turned into tea powder.



They showed how tea leaves are plucked and carefully transported to the factory where the tea leaves are properly cleaned, washed and then dried. The leaves are separated to remove the moisture from the leaves and then the leaves are cut out and put through a process of fermentation.

Kanan Devan Tea Factory:

The students were taken to Kanan Devan Tea Factory. Kanan Devan Hills Plantation Company is the largest employee owned tea company in the world. Their mission is to consistently produce safe and high quality tea products exceeding customer expectation at the lowest cost and creating an environment for work excellence, ensuring sustained growth with commitment towards



social and environmental values.

The leaves are separated to remove the moisture from the leaves and then the leaves are cut and put through a process of fermentation. Later these leaves are heated and dried and processed and carefully packaged. This is how tea leaves are transformed.

The above said process was carefully shown to the students by the supervisors at the Tea factory. Moreover, they had an extended Tea factory outlet where varieties and variations of tea related products were available at inexpensive prices.

Wonderla Amusement Park, Kochi - June 21, 2022

The class reported to Wonderla at 12:00 pm. After enjoying the dry as well as water rides, the class assembled in front of the water recycling plant at 4pm.



We had an interaction with the water plant supervisor who explained how the water in the park was treated and cleaned for reuse.

The water for the amusement park is supplied through this water plant. The tank used for Wonderla has a capacity of 3 lakh litres. For the pools and water slides they use 70% of undiluted water and 30% of chlorine water. Every hour, fifty thousand litres of water gets disposed and added on. Water gets supplied continuously for around 8 hours. The dirt from the water gets collected in a different container and disposed later on.

The Department of Social Work, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru organised a National Level Seminar 'Metanoia' on 'Across the Cis Tide: Trans-Community and the Role of Social Work' on June 24, 2022 at Eric Mathias Hall of the College

Dr Supriya Hegde Aroor, Professor and HOD of Psychiatry, Father Muller Medical College, Consultant Psychia-



trist, Arogya Polyclinic, Mangalore, was the Chief Guest. Rev. Rev. Dr. Praveen Martis, SJ, presided over the programme. Dr. Alwyn D'Sa, Registrar & Controller of Examinations of the College; Ms Dezma Fernandes, Convenor; Ms Savitha DSouza, Co-convenor; the keynote speakers - Ms Arundathi G. Heggade, President of Arundathi Foundation, General Secretary of the Karnataka Mangalamuki Foundation, Bangalore; Ms Hemangi Mhaprolkar, Senior Clinical Psychologist at MPOWER, Mumbai; RJ Kajal, Theatre Actress, President of the Karnataka Mangalamuki Foundation, Udupi and the student Convenors, Sanjana and Sona were present on the dais.

Dr. Supriya Hegde in her inaugural address spoke on the issues of the transgender community and the pain and trauma they are going through. This community has a lot of inhibitions to open-up themselves. They are born under normal conditions and transition during their teenage which is unconditional. This is hard to accept by their family members due to the disgrace they believe they will be subjected to among their community.

Rev. Dr. Praveen Martis in his address shared his experience at St Joseph's College, Bengaluru on an experiment he and some of the students conducted during his tenure at St Joseph's College, Bengaluru which included making the faculty dress up as transgenders and arrive to the college and this turned out to be disastrous due to the assumptions and comments that were made in our daily life. He highlighted the importance of not reducing human beings to just fit into one label or the other, accept everyone as they are and how small efforts in terms of education and sensitization within our circles and outside can help in building an inclusive society.

Ms Andrea Lopes, III BA compered the programme. Mrs Savitha D'Souza welcomed the gathering. Ms Dezma Fernandes rendered the vote of thanks.

There were three sessions during the programme. The first session was conducted by Ms Arundathi G. Heggade. She spoke on the topic "Transphobia and Rights of the Transgender Individuals". She started off the discussion with a little introduction about herself and the backstory. She was born a male and eventually began showing female attributes as she was growing up. She later became a transwoman. She gave us an insight into the various incidents she had to experience or face as a

transwoman. Two instances from her past that really stood out to the audience were of her being slapped and mistreated by random travelers on the road while begging and being sexually assaulted by a beggar when she was homeless in Bengaluru. The public representatives of her locality conspired to send her to jail just to remove her from their community. Later, as a result of her continuous efforts as a part of the community, she was respected by her own family. She tried to take her own life twice while going through these struggles. She spoke about the difference between sex and gender and also gave us further details about the 'Hijra' culture. She further stated that there are also fake Mangalamukis who add to the bad name and add to the stigma around the community which leads to the community losing respect in society.

Ms Hemangi Mhaprolkar was the resource person for the second session. She spoke on the topic "Role of Social Work in the Life of Sexual Minorities. She began her session with a quick activity which included the audience speaking for 3 minutes as the opposite gender. She then asked the audience about how we expect people to live like this daily when we can barely do it for 3 whole minutes. She gave a brief introduction about some of the basic topics such as Gender, Sex and Sexuality. She then spoke about various terms such as Gender expression and Gender behaviour which was an eye opening session to a large majority of the audience who didn't know the complete meaning of the same. She went on to talk about homosexuality and how homosexuals often face mental issues because of the derogatory treatment they receive and how they also constitute a major part of the minorities. Her next subtopic for the day was LGBTQIA+ COMMUNITY.

This was followed by a brief introduction of the all the



communities that come under this umbrella which included the Lesbians, Gays, Transgenders, Queer, Intersex and Asexual people. She then displayed a slide of what showed the MSM circle and spoke about how this circle encompassed of the entire community of sexual minorities. On the right side, we had the hijra construct and on the left was all the others who identified as sexual minorities. She brought her focus to the transgender community and spoke about how the hijra construct was a phenomena only seen in India and neighboring countries, the Gharana system, about how the transgender community has to fight for acceptance today only because the visibility is miniscule, how the transitions can happen both ways (male to female and female to male) and both need to be given equal recognition and respect. Lastly, she spoke about the role of social work in the life

Industrial Visit- Economics

An Industrial visit to Deccan Plast Industries and Ponos Jackfruit Shop was organized by the Economics Department St Aloysius College, (Autonomous), Mangaluru on June 4, 2022 Saturday. 57 economics students under the guidance of Mr Alwyn S Misquith and Mr Reji



John, Assistant Professors in Economics, were taken to two industries to provide students with an opportunity to learn practically and understand the production and various other activities that take place in the industry. The students were first taken to Deccan Plast Industries located in Baikampady Mangalore, Karnataka. Mr Uday and the members of the manufacturing plant took the students around the 12 year old industry. He gave a detailed explanation about the making of a plastic chair. Haitian Plastic Machine MA 3600 and Ferromatik Milacron Omega 660 SS were some of the machines the use the production of chairs. These machines were supplied from Ahmedabad they are very similar to an injection. The raw materials like Repol Polypropylene and Homopolymer purchased from Reliance MRPL and other chemical industries are first put into the machines and then pressure is put and finally injected to cool down. In one hour the machine was capable of producing 70 chairs. The final product was then sent to the market for sale. These chairs were also imported to Dubai and Qatar. Finally there was a small Question and Answer ses-



sion where students asked various questions. The students were later taken to Pons Jackfruit Shop. The owner of this small scale industry explained to us the importance and value of Jackfruit. He shared with us his Business Methodology and how he began this business. We learnt about the different varieties of jackfruit and the different delicacies you can make with it. Some of them were Halwa, Cookies, Cakes, Payasam

powder[Payasam is a south Indian sweet dish made by using milk], Krispy chips and Apalams. The food items they prepare are completely organic and some of it as the content of Vildagliptin which is good for diabetic patients. He also imparted the knowledge of vacuum packaging and its advantages. The machines they used here for drying, cutting and making the halwa were imported from Thailand. The final products are exported to places within the country and outside. The students were then given some Jackfruit chocolates at the end of the tour after the question and answer session. The Industrial visit is an experience and the best possible way to learn how the resources are utilized.

of the sexual minorities, the Humsafar Trust, changing the discriminatory behavior against transgenders and using basic tools such as speaking, allying with the community, authority and advocacy as a social worker to work for the cause.

The third session was conducted by RJ Kajal. She spoke on the topic "Life Perspective of a Transgender Individual". She was born a boy, began thinking about whether she was different after the age of 6 when she figured that she likes to dance, wear sarees and dress up like women. She was humiliated by many of her brothers' friends who called her chakka, hijra and many such derogatory terms. She saw a transgender woman in her village for the first time and there was a general assumption among people that transgenders used to take children and make them change genders. She highlighted how the social constructs like religion and caste don't matter in the transgender community, how she became a woman and was eventually accepted by her own family but not the society. She worked at the Humsafar Trust in Mumbai and later became a Radio Jockey at Radio Sarang. She spoke about how we need to have more books and information about transgenders especially for the younger generations which will educate them and sensitize them towards the community. She called out the lack of job opportunities for them and how they are offered jobs only in paper but they are never implemented.

Some of the members of the transgender community who has graced us with their presence gave dance performances. This was followed by a Poster Making Competition where different groups came forward and presented a poster relevant to the theme.

The valedictory ceremony was graced by Dr. Loveena Lobo, Director of Maffei Block, Dr. Alwyn D'Sa, Registrar, Dr. Ratan Mohunta and Dr. Rose Veera D'Souza. They spoke on the Awareness and Sensitization about the transgender community, breaking myths everyday as a part of Metanoia, Importance of gender studies, Kindness and how we should learn to love each other. Prizes were distributed to the winners of the poster making competitions.

The Jesuits all around the world are celebrating the period from May 2021 –July 2022 as the Year of Ignatius. It commemorates the 500th anniversary of St Ignatius getting wounded at Pamplona, and the beginning of his interior journey to find God in all things. This conversion led him to discover his authentic calling and



to establish the Society of Jesus. St Ignatius realized that systematic education had far-reaching influences in bringing about social changes at several levels and made it a bold Mission Statement.

Fr Melwin Pinto SJ. This book is written specifically to mark the Ignatian year from 20 May 2021 to 31 July 2022. The Ignatian year commemorates the 500th anniversary of the historic day, Ignatius the soldier was injured seriously by a cannonball in the battle of Pamplona as he was fighting against the French army which triggered the journey of his conversion from soldier to saint.
