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Panel Discussion on Mahatma - Commemorating 150th Birth Anniversary

The Department of Political Science hosted a panel discussion titled "Mahatma Gandhi and the differential Responses to Religious Belonging in India" on Thursday 1 August 2019 at 2pm to commemorate the 150th Birth anniversary year of Mahatma Gandhi.

As part of this the Chief Speaker Rev. Dr Joahcim Andrade, Professor from Pontifical Catholic University of



Parana, Brazil brought in a new analytical perspective by connecting the influences of geography on the construction of religions. He was of the opinion that the "contemporary world faces difficulty in finding out the meaning of Totality due to the proposals of modern life." As "divine greatness is revealed through fragments" through each religion, respecting and reaching out to the other religions will help us to reach Totality. He affirmed that the crisis of present society about religions can be solved through understanding the geography and moving further to promote inter religious relationship and not just dialogue.

Rev. Fr Dionysius Vas SJ, the Rector of St Aloysius Institutions spoke on the need for truth, non-violence and humanity. He emphasized on the importance of inculcating spirituality in our lives.

Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ spoke on the influences of various religions on Gandhi's life. Prof Valerian Rodrigues, explained the need to understand the pre-political Gandhi if one was to accept the political in Gandhi. For instance, cleaning of toilets was as much political as was Satyagraha to Gandhi. He emphasized that at present the political in India has colonized the pre-political.

Prof. Rajaram Tolpadi, the second eminent panelist, explained Rammanohar Lohia's understanding of

Gandhi. He also pointed that today secularism is challenged because the existing theories of secularism do not deal with religious and spiritual dimensions in India.

Four student panelists Namitha Shetty, Abner Pinto, Saheena Naz and Melnitha Correa from different disciplines presented their ideas of Gandhi on the *Bhagvad Gita*, *means and ends*, *minorities*, and on *Hinduism* respectively.

On this occasion, the Department felicitated the Chief Speaker Rev. Dr Joahcim Andrade and eminent panelists and Indian social scientists Prof. Valerian Rodrigues, former Professor of Political Studies at JNU and Prof. Rajaram Tolpadi former Professor of Political Studies at Mangalore University for the contributions to the society and social sciences in the region.

Commercio-2019 had 5 major events:



- Curious: Business Quiz and Quiz Hunt
- Dawn of Justice: Mock Trial
- Aplomb: Stress Management
- Kickstarter: Business Plan

The Core members were guided under the leadership of Ms Smitha Shetty, Mr Shakin Raj and Mr Akshith Kumar from the Dept. of Commerce.

The Inauguration of Commercio-2019 was conducted on the 22nd of July, 2019 in the Eric Mathias Hall from 1:00 PM onwards. It was presided by the Principal, Rev. Fr Praveen Martis SJ. The Dean of the Department of Commerce, Dr Suresh Poojary; HOD of the Dept. of Commerce, Dr Manuel Tauro; The Staff Co-ordinator, Ms Smitha Shetty; The Student Co-ordinator, Mr Ashray Kudva were also present.

The Principal, Rev. Fr. Praveen Martis SJ, in his inaugural address emphasized on the need of Extra Curricular activities for the overall development of an Individual. The Principal also asked the students to participate actively and make the most of this opportunity,

Prof. Udaya Kumar, an esteemed faculty member of SDM Law College, M'lore was the Judge as he guided the participants and gave his valuable inputs at the end of the event.

APLOMB: Stress Management:

The word 'Aplomb' means self-confidence or assurance, especially when in a demanding situation. This event assessed an individual's capacity to undergo stress and evaluated how they could handle pressure in a given situation. One student per class was allowed to participate. The event had a total of 21 participants.

The first round was held on 24th July from 2:00-4:30 PM at the Arrupe Block AV Room. For this round, the participants were asked to carry their resume along with them. Each participant was given 5 minutes to present, as they were questioned regarding the content of their resumé as well as about the general and recent business world. They were asked to multitask and were put in stressful situations. The judges for this round were alumni of St. Aloysius College namely Lyle Rebello, Alec Rego and Shaun D'Souza. Nine participants, three from each year qualified for the second round.

The second round was held on the 25th of July from 2-4:30 pm at AR 803. For this round, each participant was given a different personality to enact. They had 5 minutes to prepare and 5 minutes to present as well. The participants were questioned about the life of the personalities given to them and were expected to talk and act like their personalities. The judge for this round was Mr Sunil Stephen, also an alumnus of St Aloysius College and a well-known venture capitalist from Mangalore.

The 9 teams that progressed to the next round were allotted specific time to campaign their B-Plan from 23rd to 25th of July.

Special Lecture on Gandhi

Gandhiji is a Great Humanitarian: Dr Keshava Dharani

On the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, father of our Nation, Kannada Sangha of St Aloysius College (Autonomous) in association with the Mangalore Chapter of Mahatma Gandhi Shanthi Prathistana organized a Special Lecture by the Eminent Gandhian, author and retired Regional Transport Officer (RTO), Dr Keshava Dharani.

The resource person delivered a lecture on the life of Gandhiji and his values emphasizing their utmost relevance in contemporary world. He said that the Mahatma has the singular achievement of being an eternal role



model who preached and lived a life of *Ahimsa, non-violence*. He attracted the attention of the entire world through his exemplary life and values. He referred to the last Viceroy of India, Lord Mountbatten who said that he saw Jesus Christ in the Mahatma. He reiterated that the Mahatma was convinced about the multicultural character of India and dreamed that all citizen of the country live like brothers and sisters, respect and celebrate diversity of the country.

Dr Ismail, Secretary of the Prathistana, in his introductory remarks expressed his concern about the Gandhian principles and ideals losing their relevance in the contemporary scenario. He said that the Peace Foundation has taken the responsibility to take these sublime human values to people through these lectures.

The President of the Foundation, Sri Sadananda Shetty elaborated on the plans and targets of the Foundation to Popularize the Gandhian ideals.

Rev. Dr Praveen Martis, SJ, Principal and President of the Programme, in his address, explained the struggle of the Mahatma to understand and search for Truth, his entire life. The resource persons (under DBT, GoI foldscope project) were Dr. Ch. Tulasi, Associate Professor, Dept. of Zoolo-

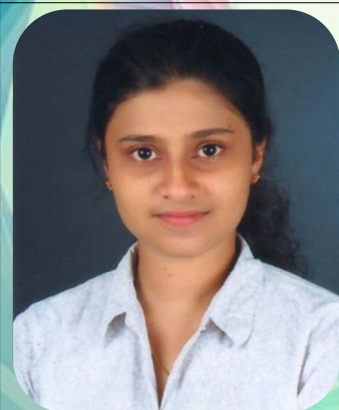
