2020-21

As a part of SAHAAYA activity Centre for Social Concern organized Sapling Plantation and Seed Germination activity for all the department students in the month of November, December and January 2021. From BA 160 students, BCA 150 students, B. Sc 350 students, B.Com 350 students and BBA 100 students actively taken part in this activity during pandemic through which they were connected with the nature in their own little way.

From the department of Science 450 students had made 10 paper bags each handed over them to nearby petty shop keepers. Purpose of this activity was to generate awareness among students and public to reduce the use of plastics as much as possible and to promote the use of paper bags. From the department of Arts 173 students and Department of Computer Science 160 students have made 2-4 Face Masks each and handed over them to the needy individuals of the society to create awareness among general public. Purpose of this activity was to create awareness on use of face mask to prevent communicable deceases. From the department of Commerce 640 students have made 5 Paper Pens each and handed them over to needy school going children in their locality. Purpose of this activity was to generate awareness among students and public to reduce the 'single use' plastic pens as much as possible in their day-to-day activities. From the department of Business Management 230 students have made Door Mats from the old and waste cloths in order to reuse them and reduce the disposal of such cloths. The purpose of this activity was to encourage and sensitize the students to make use of recyclable and reusable materials for the better environment and future.

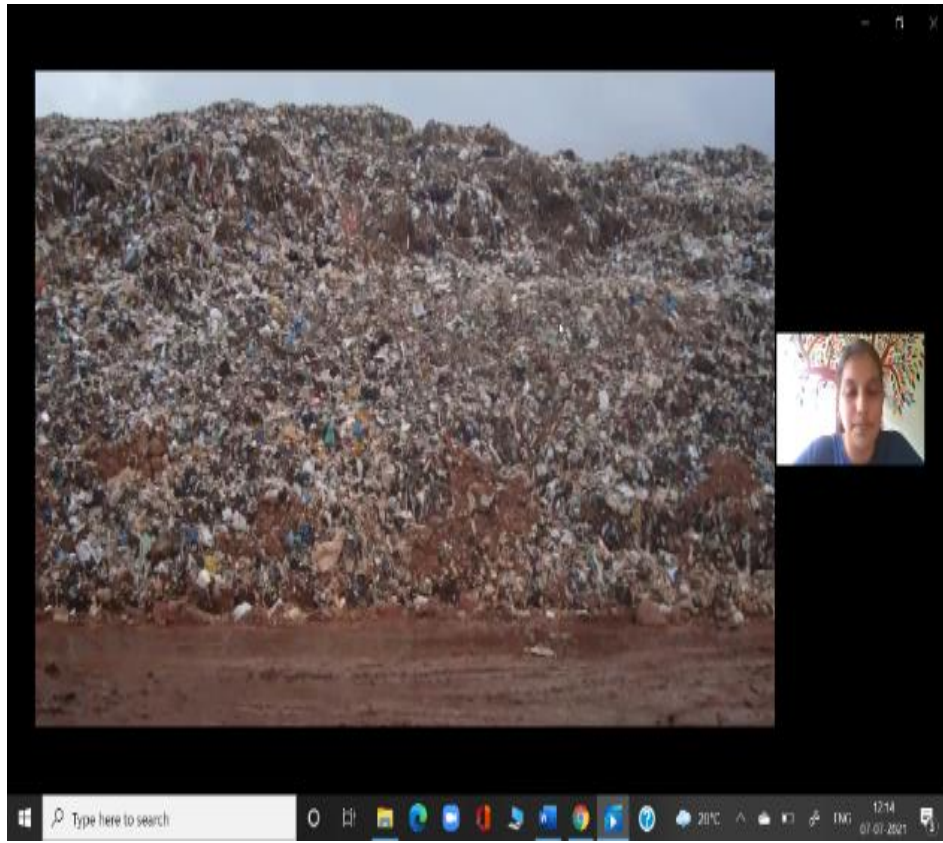

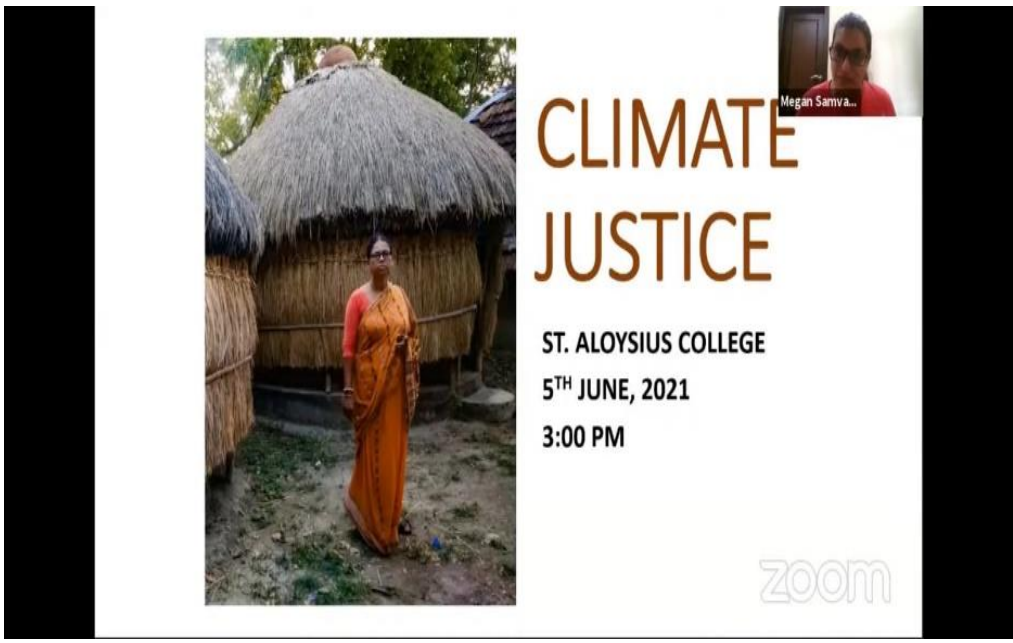

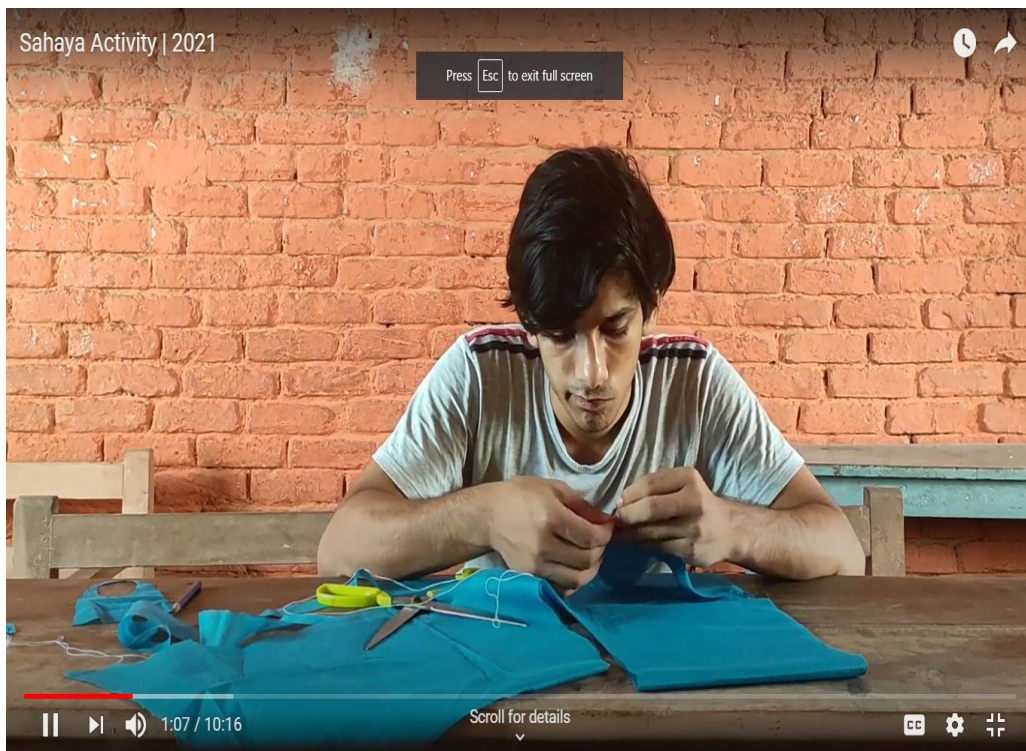

What is a pandemic ?

HOW AN OUTBREAK GRIPS A COUNTRY

When does an outbreak become a nation of concern? A look at the various stages that an outbreak takes and what can be done to contain it.

- STAGE I DIRECT CASES**
 - This happens when the cause of outbreak are imported and not of local origin. In such a scenario, only a person who has travelled from another region or country to the outbreak acts as a vector for the disease.
 - For instance, say if an Italian tourist tests positive after they land in India, while there is no outbreak in Italy, it will be considered Stage I of the outbreak as the source point of the infection started and brought to India.
- STAGE II CLUSTER TRANSMISSIONS**
 - This happens when there is local transmission of cases reported, which means that a portion of people who are having similar symptoms in their contacts with someone who has been infected by an affected nation.
 - For instance, if you bring those symptoms that cause the outbreak, you will be considered Stage II of the outbreak as you have brought it to India.
- STAGE III COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION**
 - This is the most dangerous stage where the outbreak becomes uncontrollable. From here on, when a community gets infected and the source of infection is not known as the person neither has a travel history nor has contact with an infected person.
 - In other words, people who have never travelled out have been infected with a community outbreak case right from their location.
 - This is the stage where the governments of that affected countries are forced to close the border with neighboring countries to contain the outbreak.
- STAGE IV EPIDEMIC**
 - This is when an infection becomes widespread, often globally, over a massive geographical area. The frequency with which an outbreak occurs is high and there are enough infectious people and vulnerable people present in the region.
 - For example, when the disease is becoming rampant in a state or the entire country, this is called an epidemic, and a more specific spreading across the world is called a pandemic.
