

St Aloysius Institutions Celebrated Feast of St Ignatius Loyola


L he Feast of St Ignatius Loyola, the founder of Society of Jesus, (a Jesuit Congregation) was celebrated by the Institution Jesuits at Loyola Hall, St Aloysius PU College, Mangaluru on 31 July 2023 at 9 am, with the theme- "For The Greater Glory of God".



The Festive mass on 31 July 2023 was concelebrated by Rev Dr Kiran Cotha SJ-the Finance Officer at St Aloysius AMIT, in Beeri, as the Main Celebrant joined by Rector of St Aloysius Institutions Fr Melwin Pinto SJ; and Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ-Principal of St Aloysius College; along with a dozen of Jesuit priests from the St Aloysius Institutions, Mangaluru.

Mr Khader said that the post of the Speaker is an honourable post. While any MLA can be a minister, not everyone can be a Speaker. "It is a very responsible post and hence, the Speaker has to always to be watchful about his actions," he added.

On being asked if his post does not hamper developmental works in his constituency, Mr Khader said that it was not an issue. "I can still work for my constituency. I can approach the concerned officials and make sure that developmental works go on in my constituency," he said.



Replying to a suggestion by a listener to take measures to implement the ban on single use plastic, Mr Khader said that he would definitely bring this issue to the attention of the concerned ministers in the government.

Another listener from Konaje which comes under Mr Khader's constituency drew attention to the poor condition of the road in his area. Mr Khader said that he would bring the matter to the attention of the chairman of the local Grama Panchayat.

Mr Khader expressed his satisfaction about the interaction with the listeners. He also promised to request the government of Karnataka to address the issues of Karnataka community radios, particularly their financial sustainability.

An Interaction with Prof. Sundar Sarukkkai

Sundar Sarukkai, Professor of Philosophy at the National Institute of Advanced Studies, Bangalore delivered a talk at Joseph Willy Hall from 02:30 pm - 04:00 pm on 24 July, 2023. The talk was organized by the Department of English in collaboration with the Department of English, Mangalore University. The focal point of the session was on his latest work *Following the Prayer*, which follows the life of a young girl, Kalpana and how she decided to not speak anymore.



Prof. Sarukkai was escorted to the dais by Dr Melisa M. Goveas, HOD English, who also delivered the welcome speech, Mr Naveen Kelvin Dalmeida moderated the session and the ensuing interaction. Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, the Principal, Dr Alwyn D'Sa, the Registrar, Dr Charles V. Furtado, Professor and Director Admin Block, Dr. Ratan T Mohunta, Professor and Dean Research Capacity Building, and Dr Sylvia Rego, Professor, Department of English, were also present. Over the course of his lecture, Prof. Sarukkai speaks of the thin line between literature and philosophy. He made use of the phrase "Democratizing Philosophy," which turns out to be a new idea to ponder for the students of English Literature. His story is basically abstract ideas rather than the general style of concrete specific incidents. He also emphasizes how we put our questions on a child, which is as dangerous as giving a child wrong instructions to guide them towards the answer they are seeking. The protagonist, Kalpana and her trauma towards God seems absurd to the naked eve, but the connotations speaks volumes on what happened to her and how language becomes structured lies. In his moderator's remarks, Mr Dalmeida extended Prof. Sarukkai's stance to comparing it with other books and movies that the resource person himself recommended. As an answer, Prof. Sarukkai speaks of No Presents Please: Mumbai Stories by Jayant Kaikini, Vaikkom Muhammed Basheer, and May-lee Chai. This laid the groundwork for a fruitful discussion spanning Philosophy, the Art of Writing, Absurdity of life, and Children. The student interaction, spanning Postgraduate and Undergraduate Studies departments of English likewise extended the scope of the topic to varied ideas and other ideas, including the categorization of the work under Children's Literature genre.
