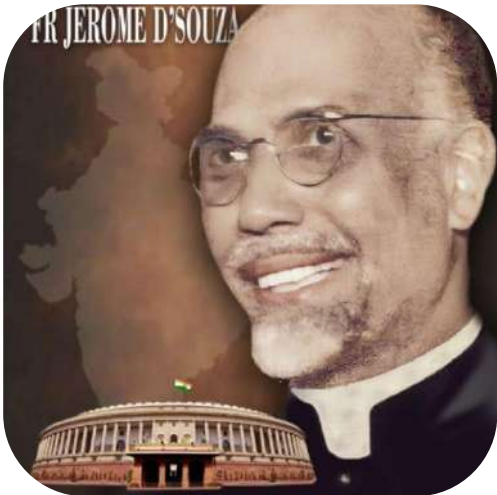
Meeting of Research Guides and Heads

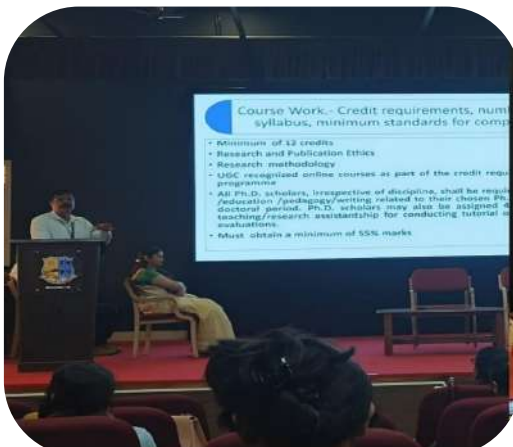
Konkani Sangha Christmas programme

Felicitation Programme



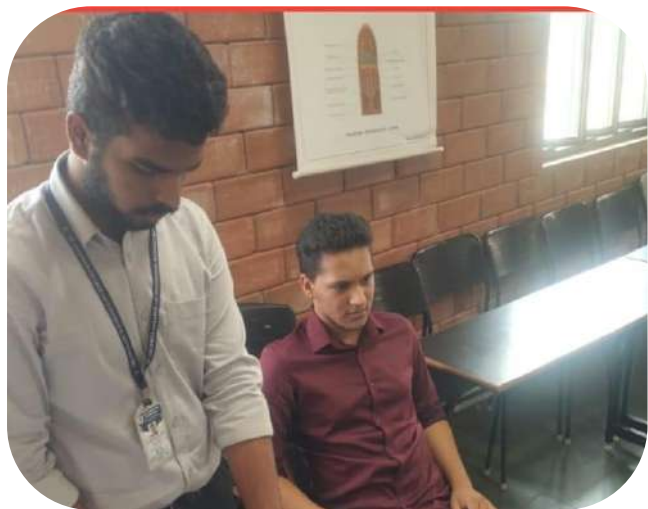

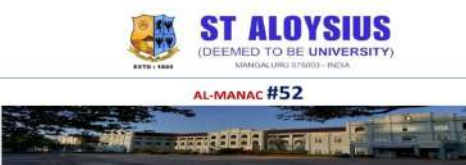
THE TINNEVELLY PEARL FISHERIES - H.S. BROWN (PART II)

HARVESTING PEARLS: The divers do not ordinarily remain a full-minute under the water. Even the most expert cannot remain down longer than 90 seconds, or work at a greater depth than 13 or 14 fathoms. Most of the Indian banks are in 9-12 fathoms of water, whereas those in Ceylon waters are in 4-6 fathoms only. When the boat containing the divers reaches the oyster bed the men jump into the water, each with a stone weighing 30-40 pounds tied to their feet to make them sink rapidly. They are furnished with a net tied to their waist to hold the oysters, and a rope is made fast round their bodies, the end of which is roved through a block on the boat held by one of their comrades on board. On reaching the bottom the diver fills his net with oysters as quickly as possible, as when he tugs at the rope, his friends in the boat pull him up leaving the stone below which is recovered by a segment rope attached to it. No artificial appliances are used enable the men to stay under water for longer periods. When the boats are full they are sent ashore and oysters are piled in heaps of thousands to be sold at the public auction.

PEARLS: The pearl oyster does not belong to the same family as the edible oyster and forms no part of the food of the natives. It has no eyes but a pair of gills. It has a small stomach and its food is made up of certain minute weeds, animals, called foraminifera. The native divers say that there are male and female oysters; the large, flat ones, males and those that are thick, concave and veined, females. They are highly fecund in deep water, but cannot live in shallow, brackish water.

FORMATION OF PEARLS & ITS USES: The formation of the pearl is supposed by many to be due to an secretion within the shell of the superabundant matter called naure, or mother-of-pearl, with which the side of the shell is coated; other believe that it is the disease of the fish. Pliny and Dioscorides believed that pearls were produced by dew, a theory that found no favour with Sir Richard Hakluyt. The observant old navigator of Queen Elizabeth's time, who remarked: "this must be some old philosopher's dream, for it cannot be made probable here the dew should come into the oyster." There is a Tamil proverb: "A rain drop that fall on an oyster becomes a pearl; so a benefit conferred on the virtuous will endure." On the Commandant Coast, the natives will tell you that pearls can also be found in bamboo, sugar-cane stalks and elephants' tusks. After this we are prepared for any amount of extraordinary things and are not surprised to hear that the native doctor or *hikim* uses the powder of pearls for many ailments, especially haemorrhage, weak eyes, and all nervous diseases. The natives believe that when applied externally white in its embryo stage pearl will cure leprosy.

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THE TINNEVELLY PEARL FISHERIES - H.S. BROWN (PART I)

Having lately returned from Tuticorin, where I was in charge of the Pearl Fisheries for a few months, I venture to think that the readers of the *Mangalore Magazine* may be interested to hear something about them.

The Tinnevelly pear banks, as is well known form the most ancient fishery in the world. They were mentioned by Pliny, A.D. 130, and Ptolemy, the Geographer, who lived about A.D. 150, tells us that when the Tamils of Southern India were in their golden age, the Tinnevelly pearl fishery, then established, according to him, at Kuru, the modern Koll, paid tribute to the Pandyan Kings of Madurai. They were mentioned by Abu Mahomed Bin Masner in the 13th century, and by Marco Polo in the end of the 13th. Readers of the Life of St. Francis Xavier are familiar with his account of the "Fishery Coast," a name which it retained in the letters of Jesuit Fathers down the time of the suppression of the Order in 1773. The Venetian traveler, *Caesar Frederic*, (1563-81), describes the fishery in a manner all applicable to the present day. The local divers were all Roman Catholics and were known as *Paravars*. When the Portuguese owned the banks, it was their custom to give the products of one day's fishing every season to the Jesuit missionaries. Later, the Dutch and the English took over the monopoly of the banks. Between 1830 and 1861, there were no fishery.

For several years before a fishery takes place, the oyster beds are carefully watched and guarded by the Superintendent and his Subordinates. At regular intervals a few hundred oysters are taken up and opened to see to what size the pearls are grown. At times, the oysters disappear as floods contaminate the water or the star fish attack them. While the beds mature, they are watched day and night. The Government steamer, *Margaria*, is used to keep watch. These boats use large stones to anchor, and they sometimes crush the shells. Oysters hate to be disturbed and migrate to favourable spots to avoid local inquiries. When there is a great prospect of fishery, a great Trade Fair is organized by the Superintendent. Traders come from all parts of India, Ceylon, Burma, Arabia and Africa to buy oysters and sell their wares. A temporary treasury is established. The police, hospitals, markets are deployed for the purpose by the District Collector.

Department Of Hindi



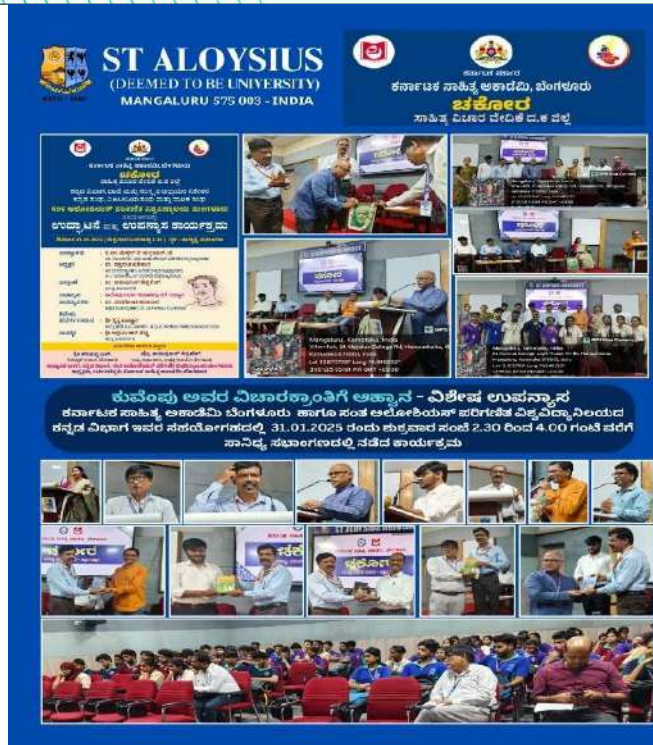

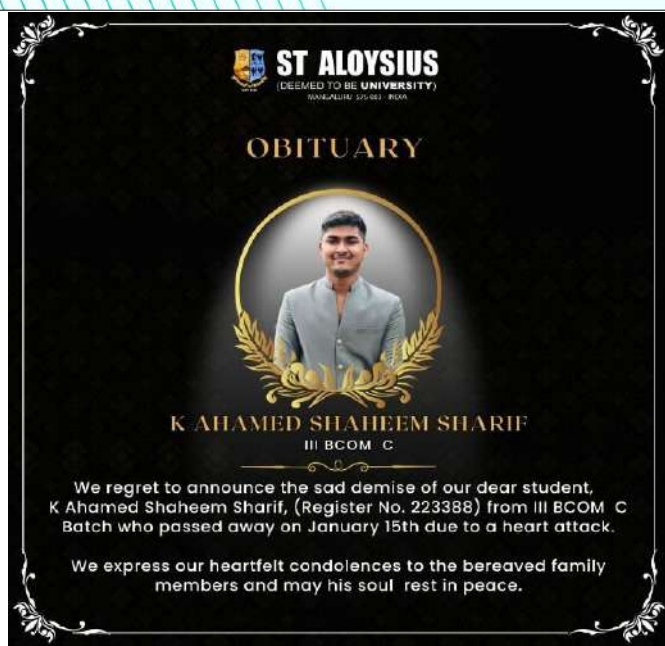

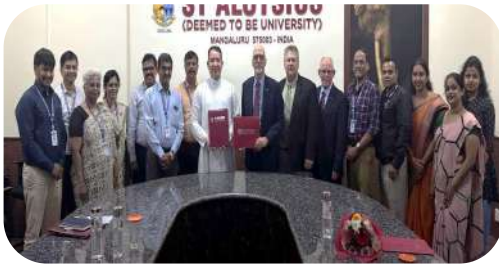

Alva's College, Moodbidri, and Dr P Dayananda Pai - P Satisha Pai Govt First Grade College, Carstreeet, Mangaluru, have been offering Tulu as a subject for the past three to four years, which runs for the first four semesters.

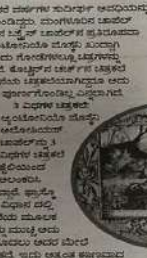
Maaingla Bhat K, head of the Kannada department at St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), said they joined other colleges in the region and are the first deemed to be university to offer the course. The current syllabus is similar to that followed in the other two colleges, approved by Mangalore University. However, there is an option for the deemed-to-be

university to make the necessary changes over time in the syllabus through its board of studies.

Bhat added that anybody from any stream, for example, commerce, humanities, and science, can opt for the subject. The syllabus mainly consists of Tulu traditions, folklore, proverbs, poems, stories, and others. Students have Tulu as an option apart from subjects like Kannada, Hindi, Konkani, and French. The aim is to encourage the language is passed on to the next generation. Jayakar Bhandary, principal of Carstreet College, said that they have been offering the Tulu language as a subject for the past four years, and currently, there are 80 students.

Theatre group to take Ranga Sangeetha to colleges

Move Aimed At Promoting Unique Musical Theatre Form

Mangaluru: The city-based Journey Theatre Group, known for its energetic Ranga Sangeetha performances, is expanding its reach by collaborating with colleges to promote this unique musical theatre form. Their recent performances, featuring lead singers like Meghana Kundapura, Chinmayee V. Bhat, Sharanya Bhat, Arjun Acharya, Rohith Upadhyaya and others, gained significant traction on social media.

With around 40 passionate artists, of whom 25 are active, the group balances their love for theatre with full-time professional commitments, performing mostly on weekends. However, recognising the growing demand for Ranga Sangeetha, they began conducting workshops to inspire young talent.

Group member Rohan Uchil told TOI that the theatre group has partnered with Shri Ramakrishna Group of Institutions to conduct a two-day district-level Ranga Sangeetha workshop for undergraduate students on Feb 15 and 16. "Interest in Ranga Sangeetha is growing, and

we want to encourage students to explore theatre music. Our workshop will focus on musical opportunities in drama, featuring compositions inspired by legendary theatre personality BV Karanth," he said.

Active in theatre for over 13 years, the group frequently conducts one-day workshops in colleges to introduce students to the art form. Every two years, they organise Anveshana, an intensive 45-day workshop aimed at mentoring young theatre enthusiasts.

Founded by Viddu Uchil, Journey Theatre Group staged over 40 Ranga Sangeetha performances in the past two years. "In Ranga Sangeetha,

the music flows like dialogues and dialogues themselves take on a musical quality. There is no rigid structure, allowing for spontaneous and seamless artistic expression," he explained.

Each performance features a six-member lead vocal team, supported by a four-member chorus, which plays a vital role in amplifying the theatrical effect. Their music is enriched with various instruments, including the dholak, dhol, harmonium, darbuka, and even the Chinese egg.

Singer Rohith Upadhyaya said practice sessions are held in a member's home, where all singers — including the chorus — come to-

gether to rehearse. "The group believes in keeping performances vibrant, spontaneous, and engaging. "When we are on stage, we are just ourselves with no filters, just pure enjoyment," he said.

Upadhyaya recalled that the group's first performance in 2019 was well-received, though the pandemic slowed their momentum. However, since resuming performances, they steadily gained popularity. "People enjoy that we are not rigid on stage and bring an energetic rhythm to our performances," he said.

Most of the Theatre Group members are alumni of St Aloysius College. Their repertoire consists of around 60 songs, ranging from folk to theatre compositions. For each performance, they carefully curate a setlist of 20 songs, with additional backup selections.

On his theatre journey, Upadhyaya said that the turning point was when he and his sister sang for a play during their college days and won a state-level competition. "That experience ignited my passion for Ranga Sangeetha, and now, through workshops, the group is committed to nurturing the next generation of theatre artists," he added.
