University Campuses Celebrate Bird Diversity During 2025 Campus Bird Count Event

From February 14 to 17,2025, University campuses in Mangaluru and Kotekar Beeri participated in the global Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) through the Campus Bird Count (CBC), transforming into vibrant hubs for birdwatchers. Students, faculty, and alumni took part as citizen scientists, documenting avian life with cameras, binoculars, and notebooks.



The 37-acre Mangaluru campus recorded 31 bird species, while the 17-acre AIMIT campus at Kotekar Beeri recorded 45, including greater racket-tailed drongos, jungle and common mynas, rock pigeons, sunbirds, flowerpeckers, koels, magpie robins, bulbuls, and Indian golden orioles. AIMIT also saw rare species like serpent eagles, black-naped monarchs, Nilgiri flowerpeckers, paradise flycatchers, Asian brown and brown-breasted flycatchers, golden-fronted leafbirds, orange-headed thrushes, and kites. The CBC, coordinated by Bird Count India in collaboration with eBird, encourages educational institutions to contribute to global avian data. At Aloysius, the initiative was led by the Department of Zoology, with Assistant Professors Ms. Savia D'Souza and Mr. Kiran Vati K, guided by Dr. Hemachandra (HoD), and supported by Dr. Hariprasad and Mr. Glavin Rodrigues. Twenty-five students from various disciplines and alumni, Ms. Shlaghana Jain, Mr. Mrinal, and Mr. Reginald actively participated. A consistent CBC participant since 2018, the University once again highlighted the importance of urban green spaces in preserving bird diversity through this collaborative effort.

Aloysian Volleyball League Season 5

The research scholars of the School of Information Science and Technology had an interactive session on March 22, 2025,


with Prof. Tad Gonsalves from Sophia University. The session was inspiring, informative, and insightful, offering valuable perspectives on research. The interaction

Gratitude Circle Session for Final-Year BCom, BSc, and BVoc Students


On February 11 and 12, 2025, the Department of Counselling conducted a Gratitude Circle session for final-year BCom, BSc,
