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## Remona Evette Pereira, a final-year BA student of St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), Mangaluru, has entered the Golden Book of World Records

Mangaluru, July 28, 2025 Remona Evette Pereira, a final-year BA student of St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), Mangaluru, has entered the Golden Book of World Records by completing an extraordinary 170-hour Bharatanatyam performance, making her the first in the world to achieve this milestone. The record-setting feat, which began on July 21 and concluded on July 28, was marked by applause and emotional celebrations as Remona reached the 170-hour mark. The previous record stood at 127 hours, set in 2023 by 16-year-old Sudhir Jagpath.

Remona's performance was a display of sheer grit, resilience, and discipline. The audience, which included her parents, teachers, and well-wishers, erupted with joy as she crossed the finish line.

Throughout the week, several dignitaries including the deputy commissioner, Zilla Panchayat, CEO, MLA, District in-charge Minister, Bishop of Mangalore, corporators, and others visited the venue and lauded her dedication.

A trained Bharatanatyam dancer for the past 13 years under Guru Sri Vidya in Yeyyadi, Remona prepared for the attempt with months of disciplined practice — 5 to 6

hours a day, both before and after college. Her dedication to

the arts has previously earned her the prestigious Pradhan

Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar in 2022 for excellence in art and culture. In addition to Bharatanatyam, she is also trained in

semi-classical, western, and contemporary dance forms. She

was earlier featured in the India Book of Records, Golden

Book of Records – London, and the Bharat Book of Records in

2017. The documentation for Remona's performance is now being submitted for official recognition by

the Golden Book of World Records. Her

moment for the cultural and academic

community of Mangaluru and an

## A Convocation ceremony inside the Mangalore District Prison

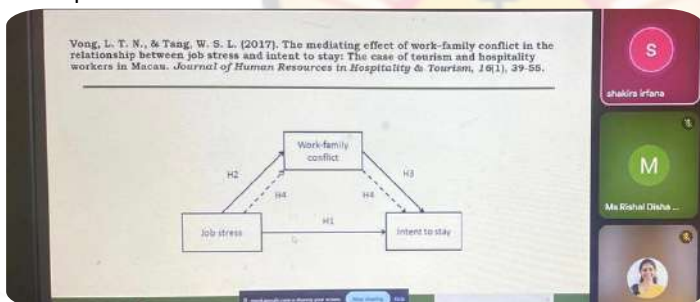

Sangeeta Maria Sequeira, Student Counsellor, who addressed the essential role that empathy, active listening, and relational awareness play in building supportive

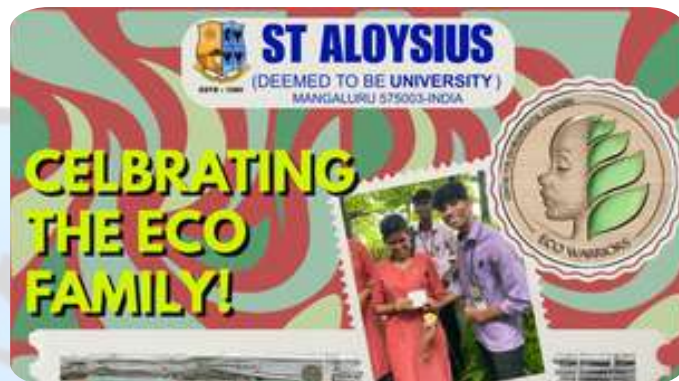

As a result, the number of weavers in Talipady rose from 8 to around 35, and overall in the region to about 70+ active weavers, while the average age dropped significantly. She spoke about how the project has been successful about re-empowering women through dignified livelihoods, skill development, social recognition, and sustainable opportunities. She spoke about how the business model focuses not only on profit-making but also places social and environmental responsibility at its core. She shared actionable points to create an inclusive & sustainable entrepreneurial ecosystem.

### Guest Lecture on "Navigating Complexities in the Business Environment"

### Guest Lecture on "AI & Young Managers"

The session was delivered by Dr. S.Ruban, Dean and Associate Professor, School of Engineering, St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University).

The session aimed to introduce students to the evolving role of artificial intelligence in the modern business world. Dr. Ruban highlighted that while AI tools can aid business



decision-making, they cannot replace human traits like empathy, ethics, and critical thinking. He used relatable analogies and examples—including the failures of Nokia and Kodak—to stress the value of insight over mere data. He also emphasized the difference between analysis and analytics, encouraged students to explore tools like Tableau and Power BI, and cautioned them not to let AI override human judgment. One of his strongest messages centered on the importance of consistent reading as a source of idea generation and long-term growth.

In his closing remarks, Dr. Ruban urged students to approach AI not as a replacement but as a support system that enhances human potential. He reminded them that this is a time full of opportunities—and success will belong to those who use technology wisely while staying grounded in purpose, values, and continuous learning. The session was highly engaging and left students inspired to become thoughtful, ethical, and innovative managers.

### Guest lecture - "Focus and Success: A Roadmap for MBA graduates"

In Karnataka, women were uniquely and significantly involved in the freedom struggle. During the pre-Gandhian period, female leaders like Beldavadi Mallamma, Rani Abbakka, Kabi Rani Chennamma, and Rani Veeramma fought for the independence of their kingdoms. They made significant sacrifices, and thus inspired hundreds of other women from their region. Later, women freedom fighters like Umabai Kundapur, Sitabai Ramchandra Madagopkar, Belsary Siddamma, T. Sunandamma, Kanakadevi Chattopadhyay, Nagamma Patil, Krishnabai Panikar, Subbamma Joshi, Vasudhadevi Desai, Padmavati Bider, Jayashankar Lakshmi, and Shaktikanta Kantak with their bravery and leadership played a significant role in the freedom movement. Additionally, there was a spike in the number of women joining the movement after Gandhi entered it, and urged women to participate. During this era, which began in 1920, in Karnataka, many women took not only actively participated in the freedom movement and supported Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy, but

also represented female empowerment, participation and activation in their society.

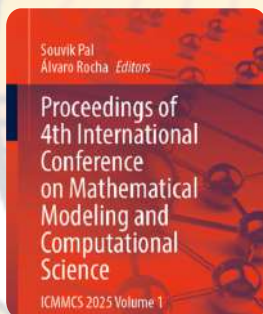

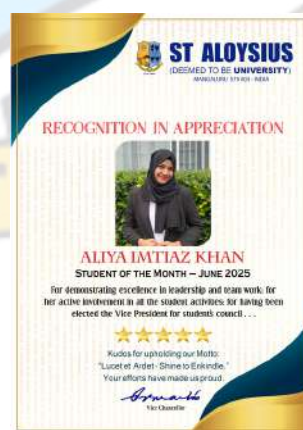
