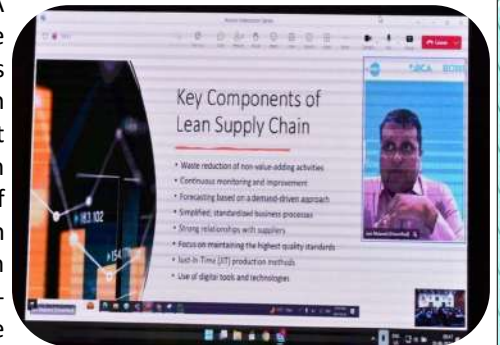

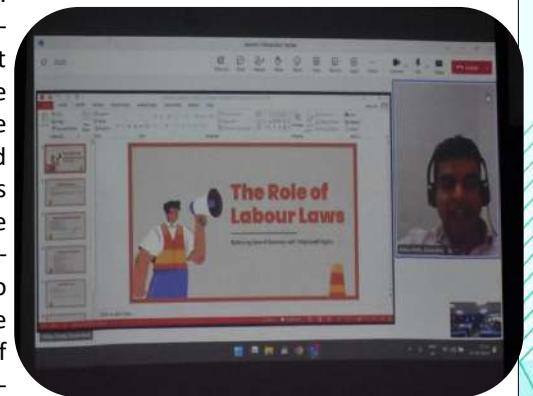
NSS - Annual Paddy Transplantation Programme

On July 18, 2024, NSS volunteers from St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University) participated in the annual paddy transplantation programme organised by Panchajanya Goshala Trust in Nalaige, Kinnigoli. The event, led by Managing Trustee Mr. Muralidhar, educated 39 volunteers on traditional paddy transplantation and cow conservation. The volunteers actively transplanted paddy in the fields and later visited the goshala, learning about different breeds of cattle and the significance of cows in agriculture. Accompanied by Ms Carrel Sharel Pereira, the volunteers engaged in hands-on activities that emphasized sustainable farming practices.



Alumni Series - Talk on Labour Laws

Mr Aditya D Shetty, an alumnus of the MBA dDepartment delivered a guest lecture on 'Balancing ease of business with employee rights: The role of labour laws' at AIMIT on June 13, 2024. The lecture started with an analysis of the role played by labour laws to balance the interests of both the employer and the employee. Mr Shetty highlighted that labour laws come to the rescue of both the employer and the employee. He narrated the important provisions added in the four labour codes.



It was followed by a brief analysis of the major wage related legislations such as The Minimum Wages Act, 1948, The Payment of Wages Act, 1936 and Equal Remuneration Act, 1976. A brief analysis of the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 was conducted during the lecture. The various Social Security Legislations were also discussed such as Employees' Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, The Employees' State Insurance Act 1948, The Employees' Compensation (Amendment Act 2017), Maternity Benefit Act 1961, Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972, Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 were highlighted. The session concluded with a question and answer session. Oshwin Priyanka Sequiera, a labour law student from II-MBA, proposed the vote of thanks.

Textbooks need to evolve with times

They should present a balanced curriculum, fostering a culture of curiosity, empathy, understanding and critical thinking

HISTORIES. To a large extent, are contented constructs. Since independence, our school textbooks have often portrayed history in a manner that parallels partisan or narrow views. In alignment with this dominant discourse, the textbook was usually to show the recognition of India's strides in art, literature, philosophy, education, science, technology, and economic development. The objective was clearly to construct a view of Indian history that suppresses India's profound impact on the world's civilisation, resulting in a skewed perception of our national identity and historical narrative. This positioning resonates with a typical colonialist.

In their formative years, school children do not possess the capacity to comprehend intense emotions and complex mindsets. It is only after, since school students are still developing their cognitive and emotional capabilities. If they are exposed to the aggressiveness of historical events and conflicts, they are likely to develop anxiety and emotional distress.

If historical conflicts are introduced at inappropriate stages of education in the school curriculum, it can immortalise false perceptions of the broader historical context in children's minds. In essence, the history taught to our students in schools should not lead to animosity and prejudices that could divide communities.

Unsurprisingly, we should not overlook the ethical implications of one-sided historical facts in the earlier school textbooks. We should also question whether it would help promote social cohesion and mutual respect among school children if such conflict-focused history books continue to be used in schools. Opposition to meaningful textbook revisions stems from the old narrative-revision thought process, knowing well that such an exercise risks undermining historical objectivity and animates into the future.

Given these concerns, appropriate textbook revisions are vital to provide accessible, credible and reliable historical narrative, understanding complex examples of conflict resolution and mutual respect. When students read such examples, they are inspired to apply these principles in their lives. Our school textbooks should promote enabling them to become responsible and empathetic citizens, while building the cognitive and emotional foundation for future critical analysis.

Teaching school students a balanced history that minimises conflict-based narratives does not mean that school children should progress to higher education can study and research more nuanced and comprehensive historical accounts. They have access to various scholarly works that provide multiple viewpoints on historical events.
