St Aloysius (Deemed-to-be University), Mangaluru, hosted the much awaited Aloysian Fest 2025, a National Level Under Graduate fest organized by the Post Graduate Departments of the University.



This landmark event, held in the institution's illustrious 145th year, witnessed the participation of 78 colleges from Goa, Kerala, Bengaluru, Hassan, Udupi, and Dakshina Kannada. The fest brought together a vibrant mix of talent across seven major events, i.e: Ark of Arts (PG Social Sciences), Saksham (PG Social Work), Udhgam (PG Commerce), Synapse (PG Biological Sciences), Quanta (PG Physical Sciences), Aloysiad (Sports Meet) and Kalaatrividha (Cultural Extravaganza).

The inauguration ceremony, held at L.F. Rasquinha Hall, began with a soulful prayer and welcome dance, followed by a visual tribute to the University's rich legacy. Staff coordinator Ms Renita Joyce Fernandes extended a heartfelt welcome, setting the tone for the celebration. The traditional lamp-lighting ceremony by dignitaries added a solemn touch, after which the trophies were unveiled along with the symbolic Aloysian Fest Box.

Online Diploma Programme on Criminology and Forensic Psychology

St Aloysius (Deemed to be University) Mangalore and Prison Ministry India launched a unique 4 month duration "Online Diploma Programme on Criminology and Forensic Psychology" on 1 September 2025.

The objective of this unique programme launched for the first time in India is to give the Prison Ministry India volunteers who visit the prisons, the knowledge and expertise on how to counsel the prison inmates to reform themselves and to engage in fruitful discussions with prison officials, police officers and lawyers on issues pertaining to extending assistance to the needy and poor inmates. The course includes topics like different types of crime, reasons why crimes are committed, psychology of persons committing the crime, jail administration, criminal justice system, methods of obtaining bail, skill development training that can be given inside prisons, rehabilitation of released prisoners etc.

The Bishop of Mangalore, Most Rev Dr Peter Paul Saldanha inaugurated the Diploma Programme and spoke about the significance of this course. Rev Dr Francis Kodian MCBS Prison Ministry India Co-Founder and National coordinator, was the Chief Guest, Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ, Vice Chancellor presided. legacy of Bharat Ratna Sir M. Visvesvaraya. The formal function was graced by distinguished guests. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Dr T Lazar Mathew, Former- Chairman of Scientific Committees of Govt. of India, while the Guests of Honor included Mr Neil Rodrigues, Program Manager- Global Delivery, Infosys Ltd. and Dr Ronald Nazareth, Registrar of the University. The program was presided over by Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, Vice Chancellor of St Aloysius (Deemed to be University). Dr S. Ruban, Dean of the School of Engineering, and event coordinators Dr Geetha Pinto and Ms Aarathi were present. Manoramma M Bhat Endowment Fund Launched to Empower Women In Kannada Literature

Mangaluru, Sep 13: The Manoramma M Bhat Endowment Fund has been established in the name of the renowned Kannada writer and advocate for women's causes, Manoramma M Bhat, by her sons, Jayaram Muliya and Mahesh Bhat Muliya. The fund aims to support female students pursuing a BA degree in Kannada literature. Its objective is to empower girls through education and nurture their interest in literature, fostering a progressive mindset. The endowment has been created with the hope that Manoramma M Bhat's literary passion and ideological spirit will continue to inspire future generations of women.



The department of Kannada at St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), which is one of the oldest centres for Kannada learning in the country with a history of 145 years, will administer the fund. The department was established by Manoramma M Bhat's father-in-law, Muliya Thimmappayya, who was a Professor there. The endowment will be awarded to two female students who are studying Kannada literature as an optional subject for their BA degree. The fund comprises Rs 60,000, which will be distributed in three equal instalments of Rs 20,000 per year over three years. Eligibility for the endowment will be based on the highest marks scored in the PUC Kannada language exam. The first recipients of the Manoramma M Bhat Endowment Fund are Minaaz from Shimoga district and Shankrabi from Kalaburagi district, both first-year BA students pursuing a Kannada major at St Aloysius University. The selection was made by a four-member committee that included one of the fund's founders, Mahesh M Bhat, along with the Head of the Department, Dr Mahalinga Bhat, and senior Kannada professors Dr Narasimha Murthy and Dr Vishwanatha Badikana.

Dr Praveen Martis, SJ, Vice Chancellor, and Fr Melwyn Joseph Pinto, SJ, Pro Chancellor and Rector, expressed their appreciation for the initiative, noting that it will carry forward Manoramma M Bhat's legacy in literature while empowering young women and nurturing their passion for Kannada language and culture.




