Code of Ethics:

- St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangalore ensure that research is conducted in a suitable working environment with appropriate equipment and facilities. The researchers at the College adhere to the highest standards of performance, code of ethics and to all applicable Statutes and governing principles of Research Policy in carrying out their research.
- Everyone involved in research in the College is accountable to the society, the College, to their profession, to the academic bodies, to all participants in the research and to its funders.
- Researchers must ensure that research projects are ethically sound. Topic/title and research/project proposal must be approved by the Ethics Committee and all relevant statutory regulatory authorities before they commence their research.
- Research infrastructure like laboratories, library, computer laboratory and natural resources like water, flora and fauna etc., must be protected with care, must be utilised for the research purpose only.
- It must be ensured that the research is carried out in accordance with the health and safety policies and legislative requirements. Any adverse effect that the research may have on people, animals, the natural environment and property must be avoided.
- Fabrication and falsification of research results as well as plagiarism are the most serious forms of research misconduct that is viewed seriously and liable for serious action by the College authorities.
- The research projects funded by the public or private agencies or the College must provide optimum value to the funders. It must ensure that


projects are completed according to the agreed project plan, purpose and quality standards with tangible outcomes.

- All those involved in research at St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangalore must have research skills and competencies, develop and update their research skills as per the need.
- Researchers must ensure that they have obtained participant's written consent to collect, hold and use their personal data. Management of research data must be in accordance with the Data Protection Act and any other legal provisions, conditions and guidelines that may apply to the handling of personal information.
- Personal information obtained for the research purpose must be considered confidential and disclosure to third parties is prohibited with the exception of statutory notification as applicable to the particular research.
- Ensure that researchers submit the progress report of their research as per the guidelines. Records of research progress, including laboratory books, are maintained according to the required standards, and that the falsification of results does not occur. Progress reports and Laboratory books must be signed and dated by the researcher and signed off by the supervisor and Chairman of the concerned Department.
- Researcher should publish the results in journals approved by University Grant Commission. Honest, transparent and accurate interpretations of the research must be presented, so that future researches may be conducted on the basis of the present research.
- Research publication must include appropriate reference of the contributors in the relevant study. Funding agency should be notified in advance when research results are to be published or disseminated.
- St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangalore encourages its faculty to organize research-based conferences, meetings, lecture-series, workshops and panel discussions to promote interest in research among student and

staff. The organising department must send the copy of proposal in detail of the programme to the Research Cell.
