## Inter-institutional debate programme on the theme "Is Social Media a Bane or a Boon?"

An inter-institutional debate programme on the theme "Is Social Media a Bane or a Boon?" was jointly organised by the Department of Political Science, St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University), Mangaluru, and St. Joseph's Institute of Philosophy (SJIP), Mangaluru, on 14 January 2026 at the St. Joseph's Interdiocesan Seminary, Mangaluru.



The programme offered an enriching academic experience and encouraged students to engage thoughtfully with contemporary social issues. The event began at 2:30 pm with the recitation of the Preamble of the Indian Constitution, after which Br. Akash served as the master of ceremonies and ensured the smooth conduct of the programme. The dignitaries present included Rev. Dr. Rajesh Rosario, Rector of St. Joseph's Interdiocesan Seminary; Rev. Fr. Nelson Almeida, Convener; Dr. Rose Veera D'Souza, Dean of the School of Arts and Humanities; and Rev. Dr. Ivan D'Souza, Director of SJIP. Rev. Dr. Ivan D'Souza formally welcomed the gathering and highlighted the importance

of inter-institutional cooperation in nurturing academic excellence. This was followed by a detailed briefing by Rev. Fr. Nelson Almeida, who explained the objectives, rules, and structure of the debate, enabling the participants to clearly understand the format of the session. Before the formal proceedings, Mr. Vishal Nayak, Assistant Professor in the Department of Media and Mass Communication, St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University) offered guidance to the students and later moderated the debate. In his concluding remarks, he appreciated the students' enthusiasm and emphasised the importance of communication, listening, and critical thinking skills in academic discussions. A 15-minute preparatory discussion session was then conducted for the selected speakers and participants. During this session, Emin (SJIP) represented the Boon perspective, while Vaishnavi (St. Aloysius) presented the Bane viewpoint. Students from both institutions were grouped accordingly, allowing them to collaborate, exchange perspectives, and refine their arguments. The formal debate commenced at 3:15 pm with opening statements of seven minutes each, followed by an engaging exchange of counter-arguments. The discussion explored important issues such as the growing influence of multinational corporations, the reliability of information circulated on social media, and whether the challenges associated with social media arise mainly from user behaviour or from the structural design of digital platforms. The programme concluded at 4:10 pm. A group photograph was taken in front of the seminary premises, and the event came to a close with the singing of the National Anthem. Participants from both institutions expressed that the programme was a valuable opportunity for intellectual exchange, skill development, and mutual learning, thereby strengthening academic ties between St. Joseph's Institute of Philosophy and St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University).

On 16 January, 2026, Karnataka Governor Thawar Chand Gehlot inaugurated the newly established School of Engineering and School of Law at St Aloysius (Deemed to be University) during a programme held at the LCRI Auditorium on the university campus

## “Python Data Analysis: Real World Case Studies”

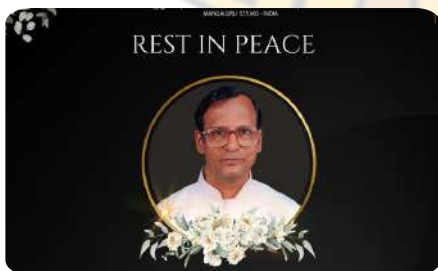

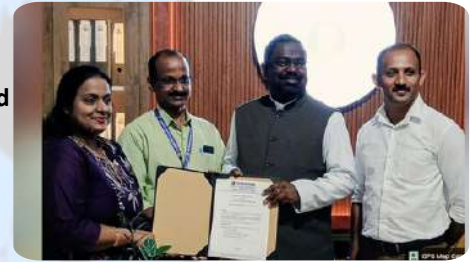

CPCRI is a premier research institute focusing on coconut, arecanut, and cocoa. A total of 28 students participated along with faculty members Ms Shameena K A, Ms Valina D'Almeida, Dr Sana Sheikh, and Lab Assistant Mr Kishore Mascarenhas. Dr Muralikrishna K, Technical Officer (Laboratory), provided detailed insights into tissue culture, along with scientists from the Physiology, Biochemistry, and Plant Pathology laboratories, giving students practical exposure to advanced research methodologies at CPCRI

As part of its ongoing efforts to enhance experiential learning and strengthen industry-academia ties, the **Departments of Biotechnology and Biochemistry, School of Life Sciences, St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), Mangaluru, organized an educational visit to the Biotherapeutic Research Department at Manipal University** on 31 January 2025. The visit was designed to give students a firsthand look at how biotherapeutics are developed and how advanced research facilities operate in a professional setting.



A total of 75 students participated in the programme, accompanied by faculty coordinators Dr Sreejesh P C, Associate Professor and Programme Coordinator, Department of Biotechnology, and Ms Shameena K A, Assistant Professor and Programme Coordinator, Department of Biochemistry. As part of the visit, students attended an informative session on biotherapeutics, highlighting their role as therapeutics derived from biological sources such as proteins, cells, and genes. The facility tour included GMP and clean-room facilities, research and development laboratories in biochemistry, cell culture, genomics, and stem cell research, as well as a 3D bioprinting laboratory. Students also observed shared modular clean rooms utilized by external industries and regulated chemical and reagent storage systems. Overall, the visit effectively bridged theoretical concepts with practical applications, enhanced students' understanding of the biopharmaceutical development process, and motivated them to pursue careers in biotechnology and translational research.

### Career Edge: Campus to corporate

A five-day placement preparation programme titled Career Edge: Campus to Corporate was inaugurated for the School of Engineering students on January 19, 2026, at LCRI. Dr. Glenson Toney, Assistant Dean – SOE, emphasized the importance of early



preparation and the need for students to develop strong aptitude, logical reasoning, and problem-solving skills. Ms. Neeraja Anand from 10 Seconds briefed the students on the training schedule, while Mr. Renjit Keshav, CEO of iSkew, spoke on identifying one's calling and preparing purposefully for career goals. Dr. Geetha Pinto, Associate Dean – SOE, outlined the programme roadmap and urged students to take early steps toward shaping their careers. 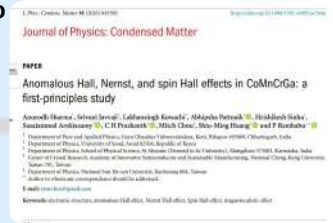

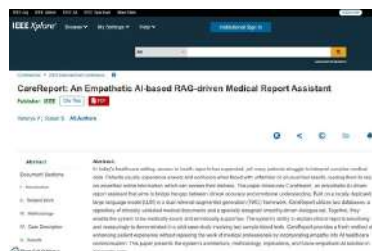
